#### **Application Package: Building Positive Gender Identities for Indigenous Youth**

##### **Agency mandate:**

Silver Gummy's mission is to use education as a means of reducing gender-based violence, primarily sexual and domestic violence. Harmful notions of masculinity and femininity that can lead to negative behaviors are largely formulated in childhood. We hope to speak to youth while their outlook on gender is still developing to cultivate self-esteem, a respect for all genders, and an understanding of how to maintain healthy relationships. We recognize that change is only possible when research institutions, community programming, schools and youth have reciprocal relationships of teaching and learning. As part of our commitment to reconciliation, Silver Gummy has committed to building relationships with Indigenous organizations whose mandate is to help rebuild positive gender identities for Indigenous youth through the reclamation of knowledge, culture, and youth driven participatory approaches to change.

### STEP ONE: Check Eligibility of Applicant and Indigenous project

- The organization is a legal entity incorporated for a minimum of two years under one of the following Alberta Statutes: the Societies Act, Part 9 of the Companies Act, the Libraries Act, the Métis Settlements Act. **NEEDS TO BE A REGISTERED CHARITY**
- The Indigenous project will operate between February 2023 to December 2023, and within Alberta.
- The project targets Indigenous youth living within Alberta.
- The Indigenous project will focus on re-building/building positive gender identities for Indigenous youth through the reclamation of knowledge, culture, and youth driven participatory approaches to change.
- The Indigenous project is covered under the applying organization's current liability insurance.
- All Indigenous project staff and volunteers who work with vulnerable project participants have appropriate security clearances.

### STEP TWO: Compile a Complete Application to be Considered (electronically)

- The completed electronic **Application Form (sections 1-10, plus Declarations)**
- The completed electronic **Budget**
- A PDF or other electronic copy of the **Financial Statement** for the organization's last completed fiscal year, which includes at least a statement of financial position (formerly 'balance sheet') and statement of operations (formerly 'income statement'), showing the organization's name and fiscal year
- A PDF or other electronic copy of the current **General Liability Insurance Coverage** in an amount of no less than \$2,000,000 inclusive per occurrence, insuring against bodily injury, personal injury and property damage including loss of use
- A PDF or other electronic copy of proof of submission of the most recently **filed annual returns** with Alberta Corporate Registry
- Declaration and Authorization page** (last page of this application) with signatures in **PDF Format**

### STEP THREE: Submit a Complete Application

- Submit your application package electronically in the formats listed above to the Grant Coordinator by mid December 2022. **All applications MUST be received electronically. No late applications will be considered.**
